# Columbus State University and West Georgia Technical College Transfer Articulation Agreement Associate of Science in General Business

# Introduction

This agreement formally recognizes that Columbus State University (CSU) and West Georgia Technical College (WGTC) are active educational partners in providing educational opportunities for currently enrolled and potential students of both institutions. Agreement to this partnership requires a commitment by both institutions to serve and facilitate a student's ability to transfer into a degree without jeopardizing the intended mission and stated goals of either institution.

## Agreement on Communication

Columbus State University and West Georgia Technical College agree to cooperate in communicating with each other concerning the articulation relationship between the two institutions. Communications may include common publications and announcements concerning their affiliation. Announcements of this articulation, of changes in the relationship, will have a coordinated release to the public from both institutions. The institutions will encourage the dissemination of information about programs in this agreement with interested and qualified students, with both institutions providing advising and counseling to prospective students.

# Agreement on Articulated Courses

This agreement is specifically for students completing the Associate of Science in General Business at West Georgia Technical College transferring to the Bachelor of Business Administration degree at Columbus State University and does not apply to other institutions in the University System of Georgia. Any WGTC student who completes the AS in General Business; is in good standing at WGTC; and meets the appropriate admission requirements to attend Columbus State University will be ensured that the courses listed in this agreement earned at West Georgia Technical College will transfer to Columbus State University. A minimum grade of "C" or above will be required for ENGL 1101, ENGL 1102, MATH 1111 and any courses in Area F or Area I. Through this agreement, a student may transfer 65 hours of credit toward the Bachelor of Business Administration degree. Both institutions are committed to advising students accordingly so that credit earned is applied appropriate to the degree. This agreement replaces any former agreement.

# .greement on Maintenance and Review

At least one administrative or faculty member will be appointed from each participating college/university to act as a primary point of contact and agent for this agreement, to speak for the institution, and to communicate details and modifications to respective faculty, advisors, and others with interest at the individual institutions.

This agreement will be in effect for three years from the date of administrative endorsement. Renewal of transfer plans with appropriate content changes will be completed on an annual basis. It will be automatically renewed unless one of the parties expresses, in writing, its desire to terminate the agreement giving six months notification with effective date to be the last day of the following academic term.

# Columbus State University and West Georgia Technical College TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

#### Introduction

This agreement formally recognizes that Columbus State University and West Georgia Technical College are active educational partners in providing educational opportunities for currently enrolled and potential students of both institutions. Agreement to this partnership requires a commitment by both institutions to serve and facilitate a student's ability to transfer into a degree without jeopardizing the intended mission and stated goals of either institution.

# Agreement on Communication

Columbus State University and West Georgia Technical College agree to cooperate in communicating with each other concerning the articulation relationship between the two institutions. Communications may include common publications and announcements concerning their affiliation. Announcements of this articulation, of changes in the relationship, will have a coordinated release to the public from both institutions. The institutions will encourage the dissemination of information about programs in this agreement with interested and qualified students, with both institutions providing advising and counseling to prospective students.

## Agreement on Articulated Courses

Any West Georgia Technical College student who enters into the transfer articulation agreement with Columbus State University by selecting a degree plan and, at the same time completes an application for admission to Columbus State University, will be ensured that all general education courses listed in this agreement that are earned at West Georgia Technical College will transfer to Columbus State University. A minimum grade of "C" or above will be required for ENGL 1101, ENGL 1102, and any other courses designated by specific majors in accordance with their program requirements. This agreement replaces any former agreements and applies to all courses in the appendices of this document.

## Agreement on Maintenance and Review

At least one administrative or faculty member will be appointed from each participating college/university to act as a primary point of contact and agent for this agreement, to speak for the institution, and to communicate details and modifications to respective faculty, advisors, and others with interest at the individual institutions. This agreement will be in effect for three years from the date of administrative endorsement. Renewal of transfer plans with appropriate content changes will be done on an annual basis. It will be automatically renewed unless one of the parties expresses, in writing, its desire to terminate the agreement giving six months notification with effective date to be the last day of the following academic term.
