Rather than repeating foundational nursing content, the program focuses on baccalaureate-level practice in evidence-based care, population health, leadership, informatics, ethics, and systems thinking.

3 semesters full-time or 4 semesters part-time

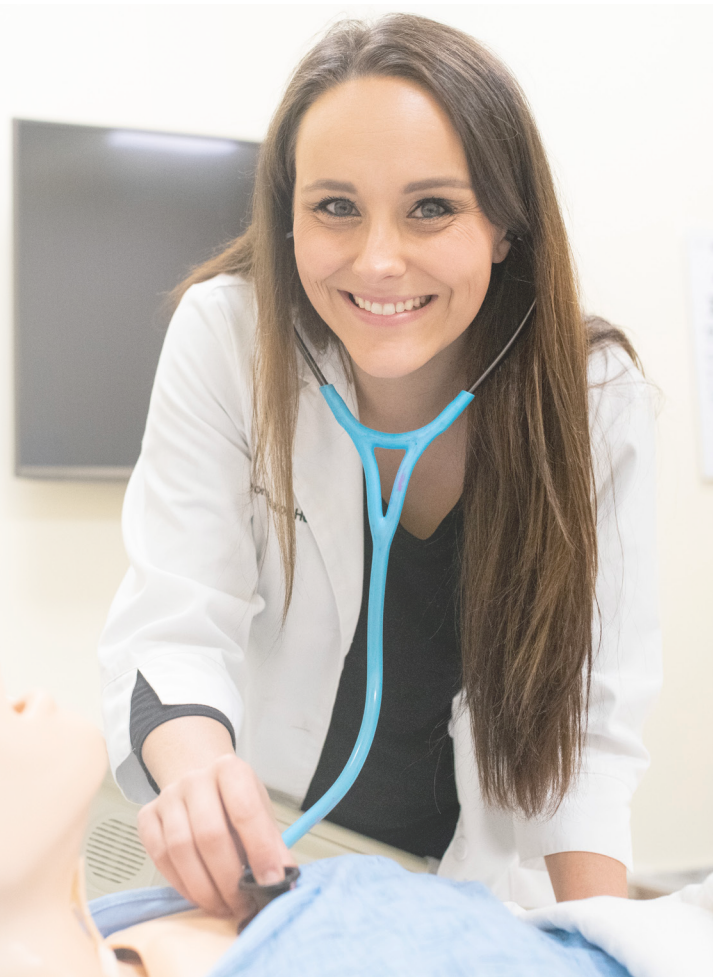
