History

The current West Georgia Technical College was created in 2009 from a merger of West Central Technical College and West Georgia Technical College. The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) initially accredited West Central Technical College in 1998. Prior to that time, the College was accredited by the Council on Occupational Education (COE). The College maintained dual accreditation with COE and SACS until January 2004, at which time WCTC discontinued its affiliation with COE. The former West Georgia Technical College gained initial accreditation with SACSCOC in June 2007 and was granted membership as a Level I institution, retroactive to January 2007. Following the consolidation and a comprehensive review, the Commission on Colleges continued accreditation of the merged West Georgia Technical College.

2024-2025 Highlights

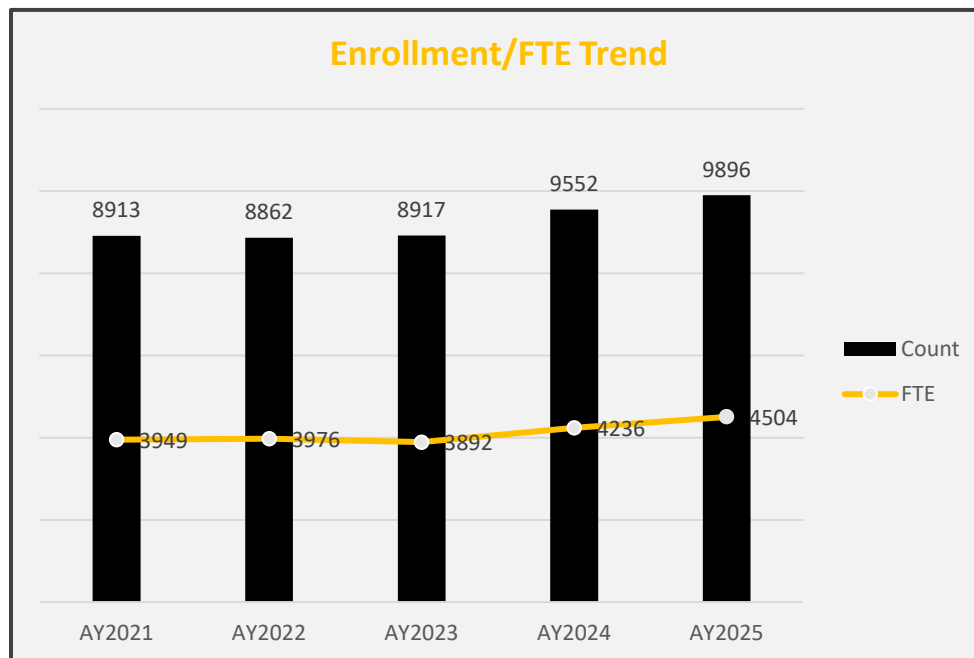
- Enrollment for AY2025 was 9,896.
- The unduplicated number of graduates at all levels was 2,596.
- WGTC awarded 328 associate degrees, 261 diplomas, and 3,536 technical certificates of credit, for a total of 4,125 awards conferred.
- The college's student retention rate was 63.4%.
- The number of students taking at least one online course was 7,603. This number reflects 76.8% of WGTC students.
- The number of high school students enrolled (dual enrollment and/or joint enrollment) was 2,367.
- Dual enrollment students earned 1,048 technical certificates of credit and 10 technical diplomas.
- The WGTC Foundation received a \$1 million donation to fund scholarships, workforce programs, and a new industrial facility.
- WGTC was the first college in Georgia to be selected as a Metallica Scholars recipient.
- The college collaborated with Microsoft to launch a Data Center Academy at the Douglas campus.
- WGTC collaborated with Google to offer a Student Summer Immersion program.
- WGTC Adult Education enrollment for AY2025 was 2,125.
- WGTC Adult Education awarded \$11,500 in HSE testing scholarships.
- The WGTC Police Department earned full State Certification through the Georgia Law Enforcement Certification Program.
- The college hosted multi-agency active shooter response training.
- WGTC was named Large Business of the Year by the Douglas County Chamber of Commerce.

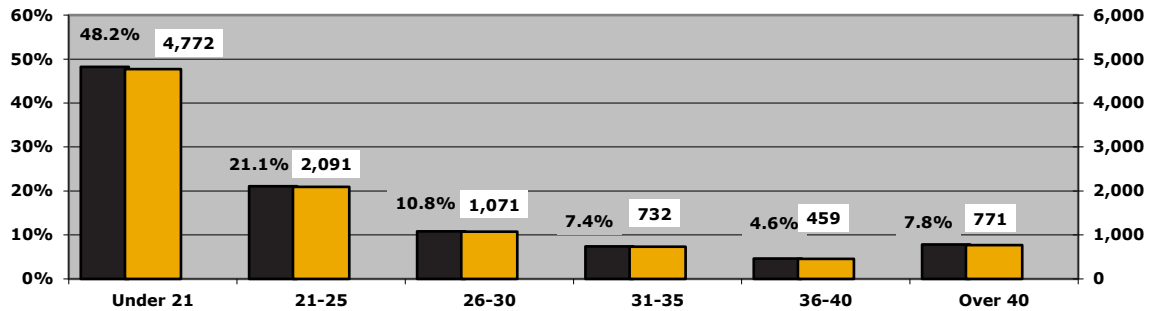

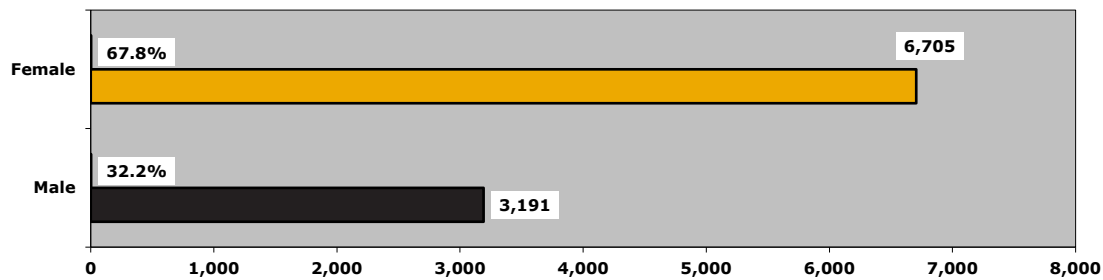


Student Demographics

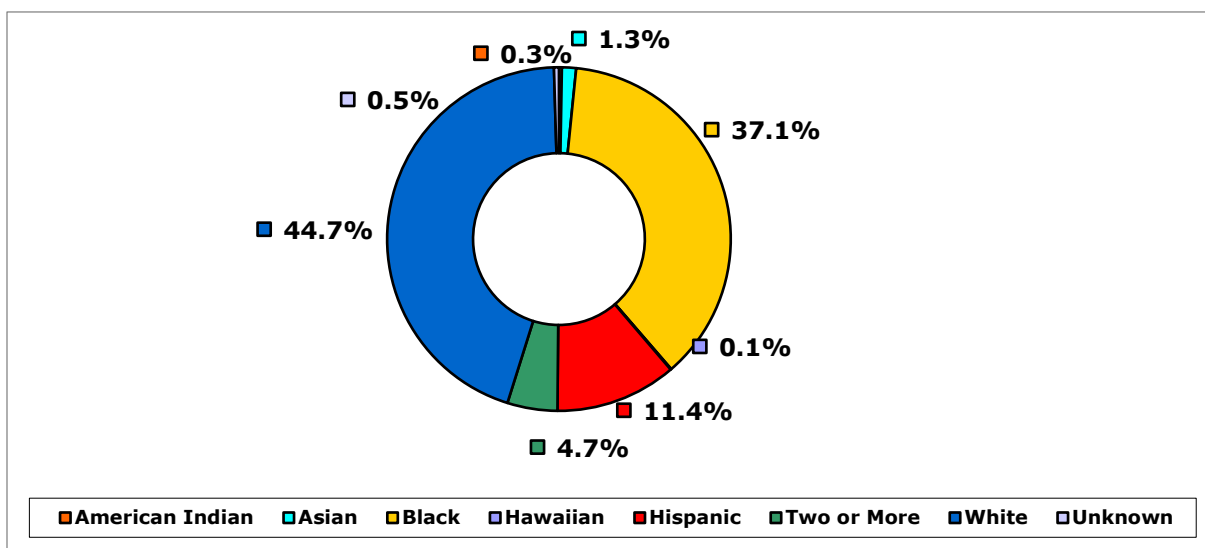
By Age



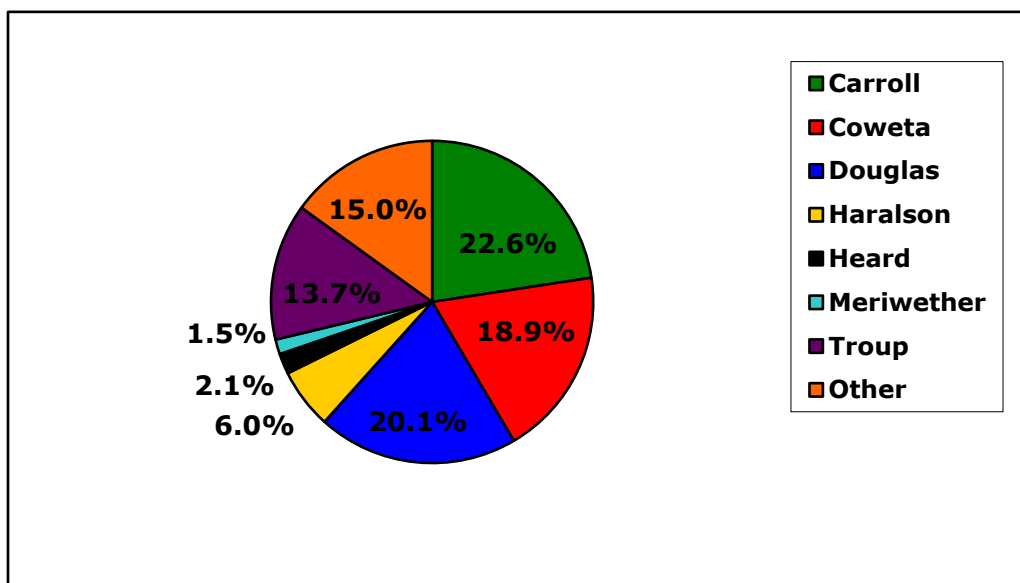
By Gender

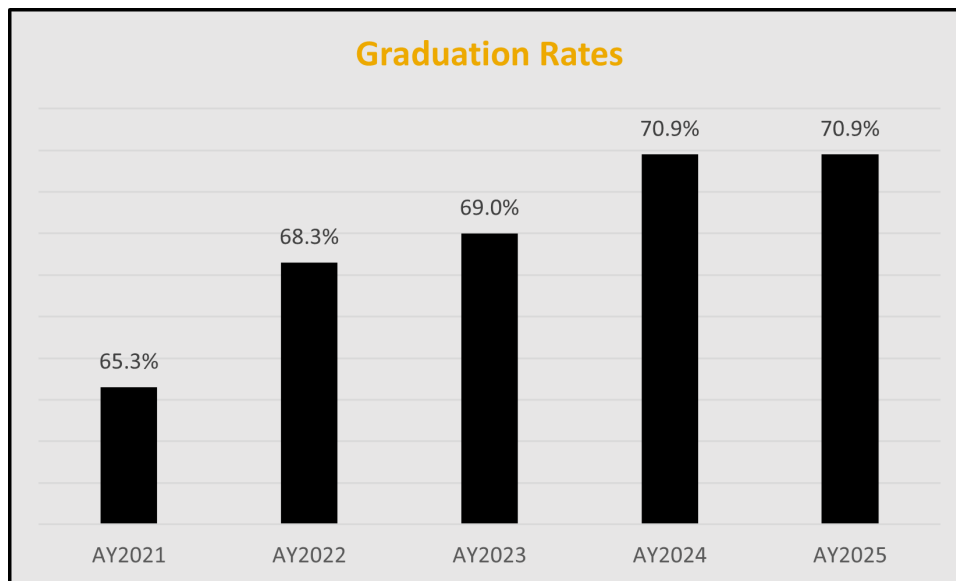

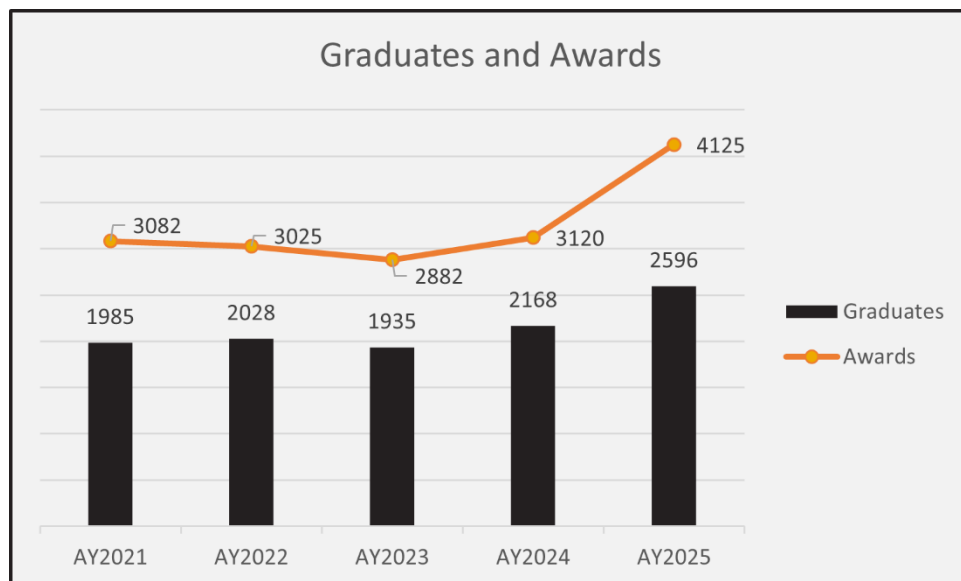
Graduation Rates 2021-2025

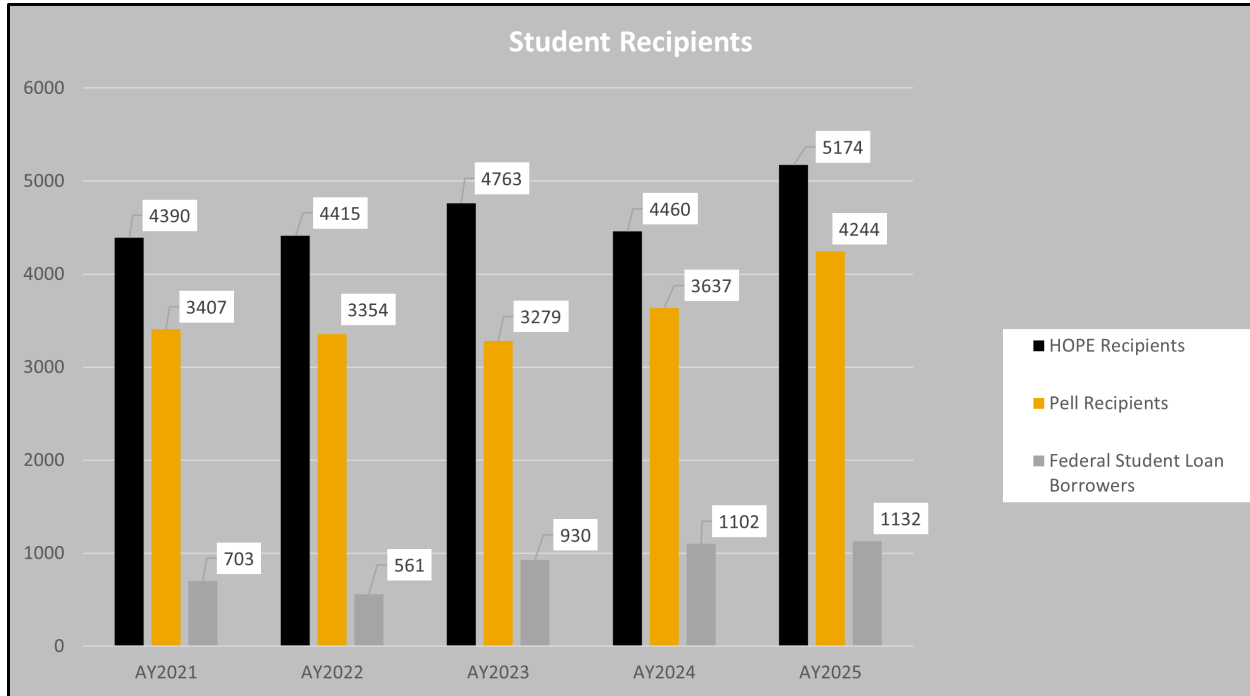

Carl D. Perkins Grant

The Carl D. Perkins grant is federal funding provided to the college through TCSG and the Georgia Department of Education (GADOE). Allocation of funding is not competitive but based on the number of Pell recipients. The college's allocation for FY2025 was \$1,519,955, distributed among divisions that provide eligible activities in support of grant priorities.
