

Automotive Electrical/Electronic System Certificate (AE41)- 9 Credit Hours

Program Description:

The Automotive Electrical/Electronic Systems Technician certificate program provides students with the knowledge and skills necessary to diagnose, service, and repair basic electrical/electronic automotive systems as an entry level technician. Topics covered include automotive shop safety, electrical theory and circuit diagnosis, automotive batteries, starting and charging systems, instrumentation, lighting, and various vehicle accessories. Graduates may find employment as automotive electrical diagnostic apprentices, technician's helpers, general electrical electronic troubleshooting technicians, and vehicle maintenance technicians. Salaries in this occupation are estimated to range from \$29,270 - \$46,970 per year (BLS.gov May 2022).
