

Automotive Engine Performance Certificate (AE51)- 16 Credit Hours

Program Description:

The Automotive Engine Performance Technician certificate program introduces students to the knowledge and skills they will need as entry-level automotive engine performance technicians. Topics covered include shop safety; electrical/electronic diagnosis; and diagnosis and service of fuel, ignition, emission, and electronic engine controls. Graduates may find employment as automotive tune up technician apprentices, technician's helpers, general tune up service technicians, and vehicle maintenance technicians. Salaries in this occupation are estimated to range from \$29,270 - \$46,970 per year (BLS.gov May 2022).
