



Commercial Construction Estimator (CCK1) – 17 Credit Hours

Program Description:

The Commercial Construction Estimator certificate program prepares students to estimate commercial construction costs. In addition, bid strategy, bidding documents, systems selection, and contract modifications are discussed. Technical courses apply to the degree program in commercial construction management. The cost estimator may work for a general contractor, often analyzing bids made by subcontractors, the sequence of operations, the size of the crew required, and physical constraints at the site. Allowances for wasted materials, inclement weather, shipping delays, and other factors that may increase costs also must be incorporated in the estimate. The estimator prepares a cost summary for the entire project.
