Program Description:

The Residential Wiring certificate program prepares students for employment in the construction industry as qualified residential wiring technicians. Topics include NEC regulations, blueprint reading, principles of direct and alternating current, and residential wiring procedures and practices. Graduates may find entry-level employment as residential wiring technicians in the field of electrical construction or maintenance. *S*alaries in this occupation are estimated to start at \$37,440.
