**Nature of Duties:** Assisting the Children's Specialist in preparing & executing storytime by- gathering books, puppets, & props, reading to groups of children, gathering craft materials, assisting with crafts, returning books, puppets, props, etc., and completing other task related assignments with Children's Specialist guidance. ECCE student is provided the opportunity to gain a supervised experience in an actual work site allowing the demonstration of techniques obtained in Early Childhood course work.

## Minimum Qualifications:

- Must be enrolled as a student at West Georgia Technical College
- Student must have a completed FAFSA for the designated aid year and must be eligible for federal aid

- Enjoys working with children 8 years old and under
- Organizational Sills
- Oral and sritten communication skills
- Ability to take and follow direction from a supervisor

## Salary/Benefits: \$12 per hour; no benefits
