

# Practical Nursing Certificate (PN21)- 49 Credit Hours

#### **Program Description:**

The Practical Nursing program is designed to prepare students to write the NCLEX-PN for licensure as practical nurses. The program prepares graduates to 770-755-7833 give competent nursing care. This is done through a selected number of occupational courses providing a variety of techniques and materials necessary to assist the student in acquiring the needed knowledge and skills to give competent care. The nursing program covers all theoretical content areas outlined in Georgia Board Rule 410-9-06(5a & 5b). A variety of clinical experiences is planned so that theory and practice are integrated under the guidance of the clinical instructor. Program graduates receive a practical nursing certificate and have the qualifications of an entry-level practical nurse. Licensed practical nurses (LPNs) provide direct patient observation, care, and assistance in offices, hospitals, clinics, private homes, group homes, nursing homes, emergency treatment facilities, or other healthcare facilities including, but not limited to: coronary care, intensive care, emergency treatment, surgical care and recovery, obstetrics, pediatrics, outpatient services, home health care, or other such areas of practice under the direction of physicians, dentists, podiatrists, and registered nurses. Licensing required. Median starting salary \$54,620.

## Admission Criteria for Practical Nursing (PN12)

Admission to West Georgia Technical College's Health Sciences and Nursing diploma, degree and certificate programs is based on a selection criteria process. There are minimum requirements for admission to individual Health Sciences and Nursing programs, and meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the program.

## **Selection Criteria Deadlines**

The Practical Nursing program will admit once each year at the Coweta Campus, LaGrange Campus and Murphy Campus.

- Murphy Campus June 1st deadline for Fall Semester cohort start date
- Coweta Campus- September 1st deadline for Spring Semester cohort start date
- LaGrange Campus February 1st deadline for Summer Semester cohort start date

## **Selection Criteria Requirements**

- Must be admitted to the College in Good Academic Standing and Regular Status.
- Must attend Mandatory Information session with WGTC Advising Coach.
- Non-Georgia residents will be considered in the selection process on a space available basis.
- Must possess a current CPR Certification through the American Heart Association for Healthcare Providers (Basic Life Support).

o A copy of current CPR Certification must be attached to the Selection Criteria File Review Request Form. o <u>Online CPR certification will not be accepted.</u>

- Must complete the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) exam with a minimum Adjusted Individual Total Score of 75% out of maximum of 100%
  - TEAS Exam must be current within two (2) years of the program start date; maximum of 3 attempts allowed per calendar year minimum of 14 days required between testing dates.
  - $\circ$  A copy of the highest TEAS Score Report must be attached to file review request form.

### Selection Criteria, Point System:

Applicants will be ranked on a point scale for selection criteria based on their TEAS test score. Additional bonus points maybe earned. The highest ranked applicants will be admitted into the Practical Nursing program.

### Mandatory: Minimum score of 75 on the TEAS exam

- TEAS Exam has an expiration date of 2 years.
- The highest exam score will be used in the selection process.
- Be mindful of Practical Nursing application deadline when scheduling TEAS Exam <u>TEAS at WGTC</u> or TEAS with ATI Testing online

## **Directions to Submit Practical Nursing Selection Review Form:**

- 1. Gather all supporting documentation including copies of current **American Heart Association for Healthcare Providers (Basic Life Support)** CPR card and TEAS Exam score and save electronically.
- Complete <u>Practical Nursing Selection Form</u> and attach all supporting documents electronically before the deadline. (Direct questions related to the form to <u>admissions@westgatech.edu</u>).
- 3. Allow 4-6 weeks from the program deadline date to receive notification of acceptance or denial from the Admissions Office.
  - > If accepted, respond via WGTC student email to secure your seat in the program by deadline.
  - > If denied, meet with an Advising Coach to determine next steps.
